Created in 1978, The InterFaith Conference of Metropolitan Washington (IFCMW) was the first staffed organization in the United States to engage the Muslim, Jewish, and Christian faith communities in both interfaith dialogue and work for justice. Today IFCMW brings together eleven historic faith communities to build community, nurture understanding and work cooperatively for justice throughout the DC region.

Our members include representatives of the Baha'i, Buddhist, Hindu, Jain, Jewish, Latter-day Saint, Muslim, Protestant, Roman Catholic, Sikh and Zoroastrian faith communities.

IFCMW seeks to build interfaith community and promote understanding by sponsoring events and programs such as the annual Interfaith Concert, Bridge Builders' Award Program, the Unity Walk, D.C. Interfaith Leadership Summit and the Dinner Dialogue Program. We also provide resources for education via our Strengthening Teaching About Religion (STAR) series and our Interfaith Speakers Bureau.

We work for justice by collaborating with organizations such as Interfaith Power and Light (IPL-DMV) as well as by initiating acts of solidarity through our Washington Interfaith Response and Outreach Coalition (WIROC). Similarly, the directory you hold in your hands is a significant coordinated effort by IFCMW with partners throughout the Greater Washington, D.C. area to provide the most comprehensive listing of our region's social services. A unique feature of this directory is that it lists not only larger scale government and non-profit services but also small congregational-based programs not found in other directories

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## **How To Use This Printed Directory**



The directory is divided into general services provided. These are listed in alphabetical order. Within each service listing, the entries are further broken down according to the governmental jurisdiction (region) in which they are located, so you may find the nearest resources for a particular area. The regions are those of the Greater Washington, D.C. area region – the four quadrants of the District of Columbia (Northeast, Northwest, Southeast, Southwest), the surrounding counties of the state of Maryland (listed by county name) and the surrounding counties and cities of the Commonwealth of Virginia (again listed by county / city name).

Each agency is listed in the category they specified as their primary service. However, some agencies offer additional services and those services are listed in the agency entry as well. We encourage users of this directory to also view the websites provided by many of the agencies to garner additional information about services beyond what is provided in each agency's notes.

Many agencies require that the person(s) in need be referred by a social services agency or congregation. We have worked to provide this information in the entries as appropriate. The section towards the back of the book entitled "Hotlines, Referrals and Social Services Contacts" provides a comprehensive list of agencies that can provide appropriate referrals, if needed, to help meet this requirement.

### **How To Use The Online Directory**

The directory is available in an online searchable form through our website at **ifcmw.org/directory**. It is accessible by computer or mobile device. Because the online version is continuously being updated by the providers themselves, it contains the most current information. As such, users are strongly encouraged to refer to the online directory as their primary source of information when they have web access.

The directory is accessed from the home page of our website, **ifcmw. org** as well as from any page of our website. If you are on a computer, the directory link is in the right-hand sidebar. If you are on a mobile device, click on the link in the blue bar at the top of any page. When you first open the directory on a mobile device a pop-up window appears that invites you to add the directory icon to your home screen. Once on your home screen, you can tap the icon like an "app" and go straight to the online directory. The directory allows you to choose geographic locations, primary services and/or specialized

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
## Ten Reasons Why IFCMW Matters

Founded in 1978, the Interfaith Conference of Metropolitan Washington has been described by *The Washington Post* as "one of the most dynamic, diverse inter-religious coalitions in the United States." Communities represented include Baha'i, Buddhist, Hindu, Jain, Jewish, Latter-day Saint, Muslim, Protestant, Roman Catholic, Sikh, and Zoroastrian faiths. The IFCMW's core initiatives include the following:

- Strengthening participation in important community-wide interfaith programs, such as the annual IFCMW Unity Walk, which engages over 1000 people in social service projects and visits to a dozen diverse houses of worship along Massachusetts Avenue, and the annual Martin Luther King Interfaith Service.
- Providing a supportive voice for religious communities that are affected by disaster, discrimination, restrictions on religious practices, or vandalism,through the Washington Interfaith Response and Outreach Coalition (WIROC).
- Promoting interfaith relations at a grassroots level through "interfaith dinner dialogues" in homes and congregations throughout the region.
- Hosting an annual event that allows various faith communities to share their song, dance, food, and other cultural traditions with one another.
- Recognizing significant local "bridge builders" who have made inspiring contributions to interfaith relationships at an annual awards assembly.
- Sponsoring the annual DC Interfaith Leadership Summit, where over 200 emerging younger generation leaders from various traditions network and learn how to serve the community together more effectively.
- Publishing the vital Emergency Services Directory of Greater Washington, D.C. as an essential resource used by service providers throughout the region to assist many thousands of needy people every year.
- Creating and disseminating "Strengthening Teaching about Religion" (STAR) materials, a curricular resource for social studies and world religion teachers.
- Providing religious leadership on environmental sustainability through IFCMW's program affiliate, Interfaith Power & Light-DMV.
- Creating a network for various faith leaders and members that strengthens unity while celebrating diversity.
